### **New collection: look, search, find (6-14 years), Dorotheergasse 11**

A hands-on rally with things and objects for those who want to see everything but have little time, or if you want to see a little of everything...

### **Night at the museum (6-10 years), Dorotheergasse 11**

Together we invent stories about museum objects and what they do at night at the museum: Chanukah lamps have a party, Pesach dishes look for new showcases, besamim (spice boxes) for Shabbat dance the tango, and a Torah crown even breaks out of the museum.

### **Museum ABC (10-14 years), Dorotheergasse 11**

From Ark to Zedakah, from Chanukah to marriage, from dietary laws to Yom Kippur, from Vienna to Israel, from anti-Semitism to the founding of the State of Israel, from loss to new beginnings – many different topics are dealt with in this program.

### **#objects (12-19 years), Dorotheergasse 11 & Judenplatz 8**

Selfies are one of the latest and most popular additions to the social media scene – pictures of yourself, your friends and family in funny or unusual situations, in our city or other tourist destinations. In this program pictures can be taken of objects in the Jewish Museum Vienna permanent exhibition. Participants can take a selfie of Sigmund Freud, Theodor Herzl or Gustav Mahler, of Torah decorations, Chanukah menorahs or everyday objects. What questions do we have and what answers do the objects in the showcases give? We let the objects speak about themselves.

### **What are you looking for here? (14-19 years), Dorotheergasse 11 & Judenplatz 8**

Margit Dobronyi's photo family offers an intimate look at Vienna's Jewish community past and present. The people on the photos become imaginary museum visitors. The participants assume their roles and look for their favorite object in the exhibitions. This enables them to identify with everyday Jewish life, festivals, present and past, history and memory, and the (Jewish) museum as an institution.

### **Adventure archeology (6-10 years), Judenplatz 8**

Exciting discoveries in the Museum below ground level: How Vienna looked in the Middle Ages? Where was the synagogue? Why it was destroyed? What do archaeologists do? What the kids have played in the Middle Ages? Have teachers been more severe? Which food was cooked in the medieval pots? A hands-on expedition to the Middle Ages!

### **Greetings from Vienna! (12-19 years), Dorotheergasse 11**

Tourists often have little time, but they still want to see and experience a lot, and a visit to the Jewish Museum Vienna is also on the program. Our fictitious guests come from New York, Gramatneusiedl, Novi Sad, Zurich or other parts of the world. They only have 30 minutes for three floors—we have a little more time and then discuss about the impressions of our guests. As a creative work order, we have them send postcards home.
